### HOW DO I CAST MY VOTE?

#### REGISTER:

Last day to register online to vote:  
OCTOBER 24

You can register in person and vote on the same day up until  
**ELECTION DAY - NOV. 8**

#### WAYS TO VOTE:

Mail your Ballot

Drop your ballot at a Drop Box or Vote Center

Vote in person at a Vote Center by November 8 at 8pm

### WHAT DO I NEED TO KNOW ABOUT VOTING?

For local elections, candidates who receive more than 50% of the vote in the primary win the election outright, and are not on the ballot for the November election. This means that—depending on where you live—some races were already decided during the primary in June. So, voting in the primary is especially important at the local level!

Did you know?... You don't have to vote on everything on the ballot!

**Your vote still counts if you choose to skip some propositions or races on your ballot!**

So you can skip some props/races on the tickets, but don't skip any elections!

#### LA CITY INITIATIVE ORDINANCE ULA

YES MEANS:

Tax increase on property sales of \$5M+; funds subsidize construction of affordable housing & provide direct funding assistance to homeless folks.

NO MEANS:

The city transfer tax remains the same at 0.45% (+ the 0.11% county transfer tax) for all property sales.

#### LA CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT 13

HUGO SOTO-MARTINEZ:

Union organizer. Supports ending violent encampment sweeps & converting vacant space into housing; capping urban oil wells; ending ban on street vending; suffrage for undocumented folks.

MITCH O'FARRELL (incumbent):

Under fire for encouraging gentrification and violent sweeps of homeless encampments in his district, especially Echo Park. Strong environmental candidate.

#### LA CITY COUNTY MEASURE A - SHERIFF OVERSIGHT

YES MEANS:

Grants Board of Supervisors power to remove elected sheriffs from office for cause with 4 out of 5 votes.

NO MEANS:

Sheriffs can be voted out every four years; in the meantime, face little oversight beyond the possibility of a recall vote.

#### CA STATE PROPOSITION 26

YES MEANS:

Allows *in-person sports* betting at existing *Tribal casinos/racetracks*. In-person betting is easier to regulate than online. Supports Tribes in determining what is in their own self interest.

NO MEANS:

Sports betting remains illegal in California (unless legalized through Prop 27).

#### CA STATE PROPOSITION 27

YES MEANS:

Allows corporate *online sports betting from any device* across CA. Challenging to prevent underage/problem gambling. \$ raised goes primarily to out-of-state corporations.

NO MEANS:

Sports betting remains illegal in California (unless legalized through Prop 26).
